Ok, we'll have to clear a scan like that with the Intellectual Property lawyers. While we wait for that, let's try to figure out what the patients had in common.

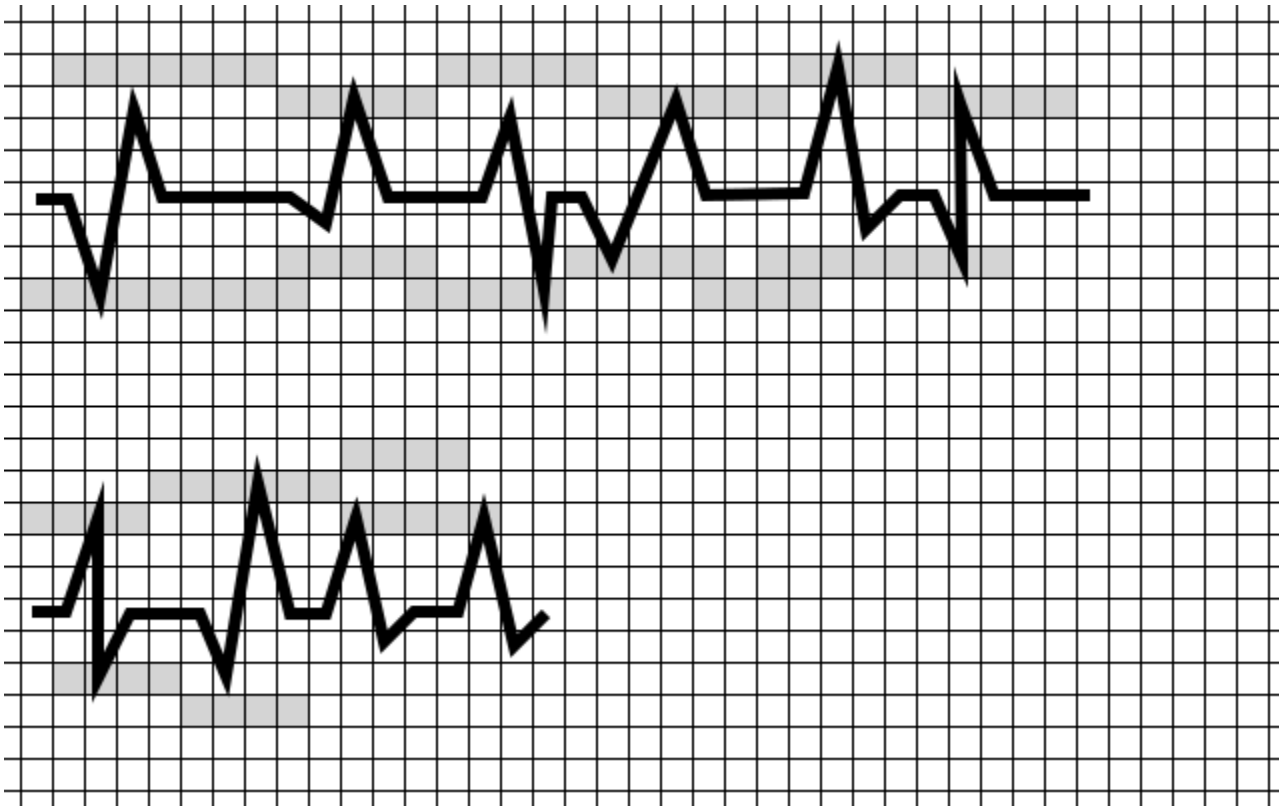
Well, I don't know if we're going to make progress on that front without a bit more lab work. Let's each go study these charts and we can communicate via Instant Message if we find anything interesting.
