Mmph, yeah, sorry, this is just the juiciest tomato, and I was in the middle of it when you called. I'm Dr. Patricia Connor.

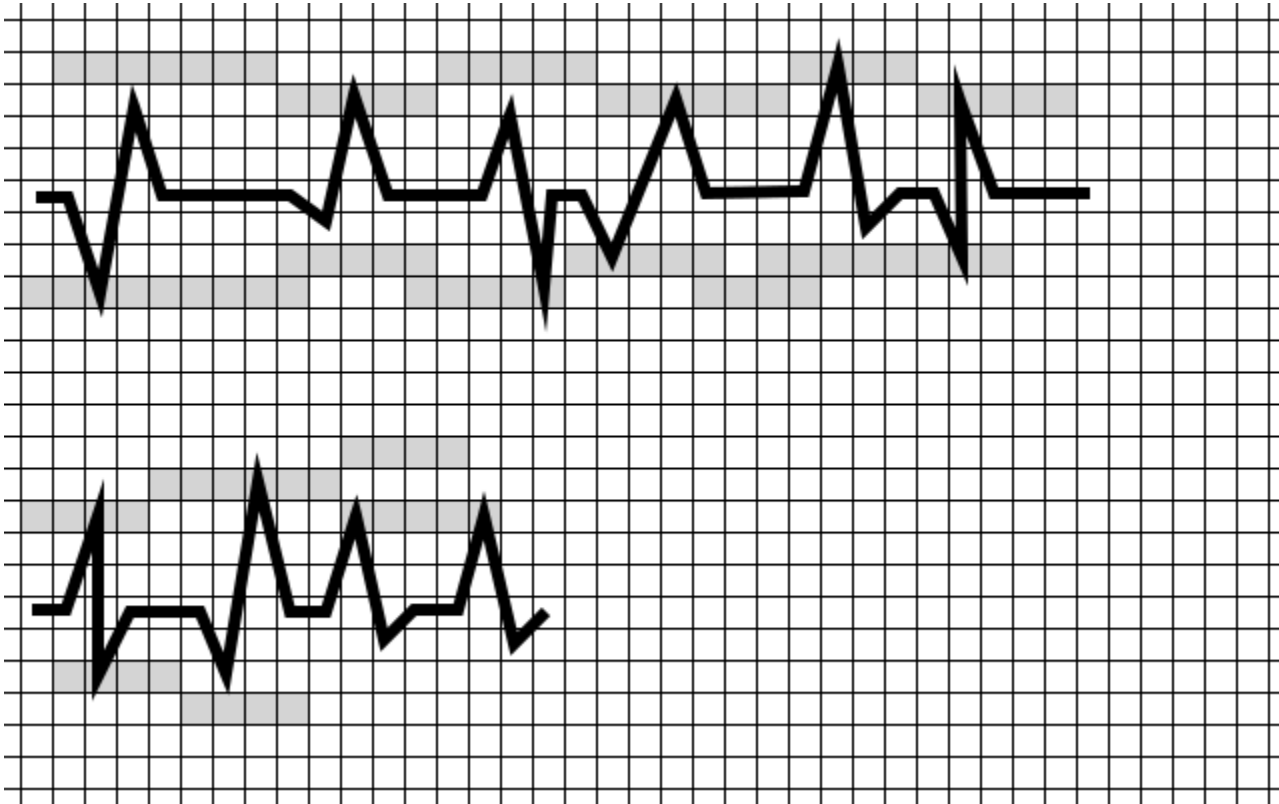
That bothers you? Readings like that could easily be caused by an adrenaline rush. It's very common. You can Google it.
